## Things to bring to the ski camp



- Skiwear should be warm, functional (allowing easy movement),
   ventilated (allowing you to sweat), and waterproof.
- It is easy to catch a cold if you keep wearing wet clothes. Therefore please bring separate outfits to wear under your ski wear and in the lodge. Do not use the same sweatpants that you wore under your skiwear for your pajamas!
- Please wear non-slippery sneakers on the way to and from the ski resort.
- Choosing the proper ski equipment is important for advancing your skills and for having fun safely. If you are borrowing your older brother's or sister's skis or boots, please make sure that you try them at home for fit and comfort at least once before bringing them with you.
- After camp each year, SNOWBIRD staff members find many things that people have left behind. Please write your name on all of your belongings including each of your socks. And please remember what you brought with you.
